Services currently available include general medicine, pharmacy, dentistry, laboratory testing, radiology, gynecology, orthopedics, pediatrics, prosthetics, optometry and some limited surgical procedures. Each morning, an elder from the local Church of God congregation or a member of the hospital staff leads the waiting patients in a devotion, songs, and prayer.

The hospital has been providing care five days per week during daytime hours since its opening in July 2005. In January 2018, the facility began providing 24/7 access to basic care. The local population would have little access to any services without the presence of affordable healthcare through this hospital.
